- Barclay, William. *The Lord's Supper*. Barclay, William. The Lord's Supper. London, SCM, 1967. Paper, 128 pages. Old and hard to find, this is a very good book on the Last Supper, development, and meaning of the supper for today. I like one chapter title especially, "Development or Complication."
- Hicks, John Mark. *Come to the Table: Revisioning the Lord's Supper*. Orange, CA: New Leaf Books, 2002. Paper, 205 pages. This books talks of how the table became an altar and our supper became a sacrifice. He challenges us to think again the form and function of the Lord's Supper.
- Joiner, James A. & Richard E. White. *Our Meal with the Master: Meditations for the Lord's Supper*. Webb City, MO: Covenant Publishing, 2002. Paper, 96 pages. This book has 52 short devotional thoughts which can be read at the Lord's table. They focus on a balanced variety of Supper images.
- Lindsay, Dennis R. 'Todah' and Eucharist: *The Celebration of the Lord's Supper as a 'Thank Offering' in the Early Church. Restoration Quarterly. 39:2, 1997.*
- Smith, F. LaGard. *In an Unworthy Manner*, in *Radical Restoration*. Nashville: Cotswold Publishing, 2001. Paper, 316 pages. I include reference to this chapter because it comes from a very conservative voice in Churches of Christ, yet says what these lectures have been trying to communicate.
- Stuhlmacher, Peter. *The New Testament Witness Concerning the Lord's Supper*, in *Jesus of Nazareth, Christ of Faith*. Peabody, MA: Hendrickson, 1988. This 43 page essay focuses on the Last Supper accounts from the Gospels and 1 Corinthains in a meaningful theological way.
- Thurston, Bonnie Bowman. "Do This": *A study on the Institution of the Lord's Supper. Restoration Quarterly. 30:4, 1988.*
- Willimon, Willam H. *Word, Water, Wine and Bread: How Worship has Changed over the Years*. Valley Forge, PA: Judson Press, 1980. Paper, 128 pages. This traces the history of preaching, baptism, and communion from Jewish times to the present.
- Willimon, William H. *Sunday Dinner: The Lord's Supper and the Christian Life*. Nashville: The Upper Room, 1981. Paper, 128 pages. Willimon challenges us to rethink the significance of eating together and explores the various dimensions of the Supper. This is a good discussion oriented class study with a lot of room for disagreement.
